

Up-market capture ratio is a measure of managers' performance in up markets relative to the market itself. An up market is one in which the market's quarterly return is greater than or equal to zero. Down-Market Capture is a measure of managers' performance in down markets relative to the market itself. A down market is one in which the market's quarterly return is less than zero. Information ratio is the ratio of annualized expected residual return to residual risk. R-squared measures the strength of the linear relationship between the Fund and its benchmark. R-Squared at 1 implies perfect linear relationship and zero implies no relationship exists. Sharpe ratio is a risk-adjusted measure, calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. The higher the sharpe ratio, the better the fund's historical risk adjusted performance. Standard deviation measures the risk or volatility of an investment's return over a particular time period; the greater the number, the greater the risk. Tracking error is the dispersal of differences between the returns obtained by the Fund and the benchmark variation.

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The Russell 1000® Growth Index measures a growth-oriented subset of the Russell 1000 Index, which tracks approximately 1,000 of the large mid-sized capitalization companies in the United States equities market. Investors cannot invest directly in an index and unmanaged index returns do not reflect any fees, expenses or sales charges.
